- 1 cup uncooked oatmeal
- 1 1/2 cups hot water OR meat juices
- 1 cup grated cheddar cheeses
- 1 beaten egg
- 1 cup wheat germ
- 1/4 cup margarine
- ½ cup powdered milk
- 1/4 tsp. Salt
- 1 cup cornmeal
- 3 cups whole wheat flour

Membership Meeting Minutes Focus Group Report

1996 Accomplishments

- Primary objective for 1996 was to regain our financial stability. At the start of 1996 our balance was approximately \$1100, today it is \$2100
- Conducted a survey of DSA members. 40% responded. The wish list form the survey included:
 - More programs. We have had 3 programs Whelp Watch, Bloat, CPR/First Aid
 - Keep meeting to 1-1.5 hours in length.
 - Have less formal events. We held our 1st Sammy Daze.
 - Meeting location. While we did not find a location that is agreeable to all members, Littleton Hospital offered us use of their facility, which has multi-media access, for no charge.
- Our Breeder Showcase booth was awarded 1st prize.
- The 1996 Specialty show made money, we had a record attendance and it was the first year for the working sweeps class (and the last year for team obedience!)
- Denver Samoyed Rescue was awarded 1st place in the Canine Division at the St. Patrick's Day Parade.
- Our All Breed Match made over \$500.
- Our Obedience Handling classes generated enough money to make a significant contribution in covering the expense of our Obedience judge.
- DSA members participated in pack hikes to benefit victims of the Buffalo Creek fires and help reforest the area.
- · 4 of our Sams successfully passed their herding instinct test.
- Ways and Means has successfully implemented several new ideas to generate funds:
 - Note cards, note pads, address labels
 - Ring stewarding
- Through the generous efforts of Geoff and Brenda Abbott, DSA has a new club banner
- Our Sam-O-Gram has a brand new look and is being printed free of charge, courtesy Littleton Hospital.
- We had a successful Tournament and B-Match.
- DSA members helped implement a pet therapy program at Littleton Hospital
- As of November 2nd, we had placed 46 rescue dogs.

1997 Suggestions

 Question about what AKC requires of us as a club. There was no definite answer, however we do know if we hold a Specialty, we must conduct a B-Match. AKC now has a strong focus on rescue as well. Also education, we need to hold a minimum of 3 educational events per year.

Communication:

- In an effort to better communicate with our membership, on a quarterly basis we could send out a tentative agenda of things to be covered at upcoming meetings and scheduled events.
- Send the Sam-O-Gram to everyone instead of the Monthly Reminder card. It would also give people more time to go through the newsletter, rather than a rushed review at the meeting.
- The Sam-O-Gram is intended to be a one-stop-shop for DSA related information and local events.
- Need to consider the costs and specs we previously gave to Littleton Hospital if we are going to send a Sam-O-Gram out to everyone.
- Should we raise dues to cover the cost of mailing out the Sam-O-Gram to everyone? \$15 for individual, \$20 for family. This would also help our financial position so we don't have as much pressure to present fund-raising events.

Working Dog Events:

 Need to have more organization and more notice about the Working Dog events.

- Select, or pinpoint, specific people to provide information on upcoming events to Thalia for the newsletter. For example, sled races, weight pulls, herding trials, etc.
- Highlight these special events in the newsletter.
- Question on the Organization for Working Dogs versus SCA.
 We can use OWD points towards SCA working titles. OWD is a National organization, no local clubs exist. For additional information, contact Donna Dannen (303-747-2047).

Programs:

- Spend more time to present our programs. Possibly determine which months are the slowest, March?, July?, October?, and use the entire meeting time for a program, with only a cursory review of club business.
- We can also conduct programs outside of a club meeting. For example, a "Learn to Sled" event. We have a lot of people with Working Dog knowledge within the club, let's use them as a resource!

Constitution:

 Should we change or amend the constitution to include working dog activities? Rescue efforts? Other? Both of these activities have really just come to be general topics in the last 5 years of so. AKC needs to approve any changes to the constitution.

• Judges:

- Should we continue to alternate Breeder Judges, with All-Breed Judges at our Specialty? All-Breed Judges would most likely draw more entries and be cheaper, expense wise and more judges would be available for selection.
- Need to establish relationships with other breed clubs. That
 would allow us to exchange stewarding resources, programs,
 judges for Sweeps, support for each other's events, etc. Also
 with other Samoyed clubs across the nation. In order to
 exchange judges, we will need to plan the events that require a
 judge early in the year so people will have notice to make plans.
- Provide a pool of names of people that are interested in judging.

Tournament:

 Change the focus of the Tournament to be non-competitive. Instead of sending the winner to the National, lower the cost to encourage participation and have the money go to the Club. Possibly eliminate the Tournament all together and have instead a Handling Clinic, Measurement Clinic, Senior Handling (exchange of dogs) etc.

Miscellaneous:

- Need to build our membership. What about including our new rescue owners, particularly when we are presenting a program? Would need to focus on other things besides conformation, working dog events, for example.
- Do we need to stop doing some of the things we're currently doing? We need to continue to expand, while recognizing that in different years, different things take precedence.
- Put a questionnaire about "What are you interested in for this year? Your top priorities." in with the dues notices.
- The Board's function is to manage the Club. They will pull together the short-term and long-term plans and can delegate to a committee when necessary.
- We need to have more participation in the Pet Therapy program in recognition of Littleton Hospital's contribution(s) to our club.
- What are some fund raising ideas?
 - Publish a book of pedigrees?? Carol Beatty offered to show us examples and check in to how much work it would be to put one of these together.
 - Chip clinic
 - Stewarding
 - Tattoo clinic
 - Grocery store certificates Can we include Albertsons?
- We need to follow up on the suggestion that we have a mentoring program for new members.



Pupsicles for Hot Dogs

Make some chicken popsicles for your pup to munch. Simply freeze chicken broth in ice cube trays. If you add a stick when they are partially frozen, you can hold the treat while your pooch licks away. *Canine Classified*

Sunshine Liver Bait

Mix together:

1 lb. finely ground raw liver

1 cup flour

½ cup cornmeal

1 to 3 tablespoons garlic salt.

Spread on a lightly greased piece of tin foil on a cookie sheet. It is very THICK - like wet concrete! Bake at 350 degrees for 30 minutes.

When it is done, peel off the tin foil, break the liver into pieces and then freeze in packages to fit your needs.

This bait will keep without refrigeration for at least a week IF it isn't in the sun or extreme heat; it breaks into tiny pieces using only your fingernails; it doesn't go mushy, and dogs will do just about ANYTHING for just a crumb of it! It will keep for several weeks in the refrigerator, it can be FROZEN AND REFROZEN numerous times, and it thaws in less than 5 minutes!

Ralphie the Buffalo Dog Cookies

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 teaspoons garlic salt

2 tablespoons light cream

1 beaten egg

1 cup whole wheat flour

1 cup yellow cornmeal

1 package dry yeast

1 can beef broth

3/4 cup GRAPENUTS breakfast cereal

1/2 cup non-fat dry milk

1/4 cup warm water

Combine all dry ingredients in a large bowl. Dissolve the yeast in the warm water and add to the beef broth. Combine the dry ingredients with the yeast and broth mixture. Knead for 8 minutes. Roll on a floured board and use a Ralphie the Buffalo cookie cutter to cut the stiff dough into pieces. Combine the light cream and beaten egg. Brush each cookie liberally with the egg mixture. Bake at 300 degrees for 50-60 minutes.

Skye Terrier Dog Cookies

2 ½ cups all-purpose flour 2 cups whole wheat flour

1 cup rye flour

1 package dry yeast

1 can chicken or beef broth

1 jar liver baby food

½ cup non-fat dry milk

½ teaspoon garlic powder

1/4 cup warm water

4 teaspoons salt (may be eliminated)

Dissolve the yeast in the warm water. Add the broth. Mix the dry ingredients and add to the liquid ingredients. Knead for 3 minutes. Roll on floured board and use a cookie cutter to cut the stiff dough into pieces. Brush on a mixture of a beaten egg and milk, then bake at 300 degrees for 40 minutes. Either leave the cookies in the oven or place them on the counter overnight to dry.

Peanut Butter Dog Cookies

3 cups whole wheat flour

2 beaten eggs

1 1/2 cups bran breakfast cereal

1 cup milk

1 teaspoon salt

1/2 cup quick-cooking oatmeal

½ cup creamy peanut butter

½ cup safflower oil

1/4 cup brown sugar or honey

Combine the dry ingredients in a bowl. Stir in the remaining ingredients. Roll on a floured board and use a cookie cutter to cut the stiff dough into pieces. Bake at 350 degrees for 20-25 minutes.

Finicky-eater Meat Loaf

3 pounds hamburger

3 cups old-fashioned Quaker Oats

2 eggs

1 pound canned green beans

1 pound canned carrots

1 teaspoon garlic salt

1 28 oz can stewed tomatoes

* mill

Place the oats in a bowl and cover completely with milk. Allow the oats to soak for 30-35 minutes. Blend all of the vegetables including their canned liquid. Mix the eggs and hamburger. Combine all ingredients and mix thoroughly. Place in a 2 inch high baking pan. Bake at 300 degrees until all liquid has evaporated. Cool and serve. Store in the refrigerator.

Finicky-eater Chicken Gizzards

1 cup cooked, diced carrots

1 soft-cooked egg

1 tablespoon vegetable oil

½ teaspoon garlic powder

½ cup white rice

½ pound chicken gizzards

Boil the chicken gizzards in water until done. Save the water and cook the white rice in it. Dice the chicken gizzards and add to all other ingredients. Stir thoroughly and mix with your dog's regular kibble.

Cheddar Cheese Dog Cookies

10 tablespoons bacon fat

2 cup all-purpose flour

2 minced garlic clove

1 cup finely grated cheddar cheese

Blend the bacon fat and the cheese until

smooth. Add the minced garlic. Mix in the flour. Make into nuggets by rolling the dough into a 1 ½ inch diameter log and cutting into 1 ½ inch lengths. Chill the cut pieces until they are firm, then place them on an ungreased cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 minutes or until slightly brown.

Hardtack Cookies

3 cups whole wheat flour

2 cups all-purpose flour

2 cups cracked wheat

2 cups chicken or beef broth

1 cup cornmeal

1 cup wheat germ

1 beaten egg

1 tablespoon dry yeast

1 teaspoon salt

½ cup honey

1/4 cup milk

1/4 cup warm water

1/4 cup bacon grease

Dissolve the yeast in the warm water and add the broth. Add the egg, milk, honey, and bacon grease and heat until lukewarm Mix the dry ingredients and add to the liquid ingredients. Knead for 3-4 minutes. Roll on a floured board and use a cookie cutter to cut the stiff dough into pieces. Brush on a mixture of beaten egg and milk, then bake at 350 degrees for 45 minutes. Either leave the cookies in the oven or place them on a counter overnight to dry.

CSU Rams Dog Cookies

1 cup whole wheat flour

1 beaten egg

1 teaspoon sugar

1 chicken or beef bouillon cube

3/4 cup non-fat dry milk

½ cup all-purpose flour

1/2 quick-cooking rolled oats

1/2 cup yellow cornmeal

½ cup hot water

1/3 cup of shortening

Combine flours, milk powder, rolled oats, cornmeal and sugar in a medium bowl. Cut in the shortening and stir in the egg. Dissolve the bouillon cube in the warm water and add to the mixture. Knead for 5 minutes. Roll on a floured board and use a cookie cutter to cut the stiff dough into pieces. Or make into nuggets by rolling the dough into 1 ½ inch diameter log and cutting into 1 ½ inch lengths. Microwave at 50 percent power for 10 minutes, rotating every 2 minutes and turning over completely at 5 minutes. Addtional cooking time may be required based on your microwave oven. Or bake in the oven at 350 degrees for 30-40 minutes. Cool on a rack and serve.


