The 107th Congress: A Work in Progress

As we take stock of the 107th Congress to date, we see major achievements and serious setbacks for animal protection issues...

A Note on the Scorecard

Many animal protection issues never receive a recorded vote in Congress. Some are enacted by voice vote and some languish. To more accurately measure legislators' support for the broad range of animal issues, we count cosponsorships of certain key bills along with recorded votes. Cosponsoring a bill is a meaningful way for legislators to help the bill advance in Congress. We also count those who signed letters seeking increased funding to enforce key animal welfare laws, as this is a tangible way for legislators to help improve the lives of millions of animals.

What To Do If Your Dog Has Been Skunked!

The magic formula:
1 quart 3% hydrogen peroxide
1/4 C baking soda
1 teaspoon liquid soap

(Dawn dishwashing detergent is often recommended, though any dish soap will work)

Mix in a bucket or bowl; it will be fizzy, a clue that you shouldn't try to mix

it or store it in a bottle or other closed container.

Thoroughly wet your dog with the solution. Knead it well into his coat, to chemically alter every bit of the thiols [skunk spray component] on his hair. Be careful to keep formula out of the dog's eyes, nose, and mouth; you can use a sponge to carefully wipe it onto his face. Follow the bath with a thorough rinse.

Scored Issues:

Cockfighting

Legislation would close the loophole in the federal Animal Welfare Act that allowed interstate shipment of birds for fighting and undermined enforcement of the cockfighting bans that exist in 47 states.

STATUS: Signed into law on 05/13/02 as part of the final farm bill, along with provisions to close the loophole that allowed export of fighting birds and dogs and to triple the federal fines for animal fighting violations.

Puppy Mills

Legislation would improve USDA enforcement of the Animal Welfare Act at commercial dog breeding operations in three ways:

- Require that standards be developed to ensure adequate socialization of dogs;
- Require that females be at least one year old before being bred and be given time to recover between litters, for the health of the mother and puppies;
- Establish a mandatory "three strikes and you're out" system for chronic violators to lose their licenses.

STATUS: Rejected in House-Senate conference on the farm bill.

Downed Animals

Legislation would require humane euthanasia of farm ani-

mals that are too sick or injured to walk unassisted at stockyards, auctions, and other intermediate livestock markets. By prohibiting the marketing of downed animals, this bill would create a financial incentive for careful, humane handling of all farm animals and also help prevent contamination of food destined for human consumption. STATUS: Dropped in House-Senate conference on the farm bill, which substituted language calling for a study and authorizing discretionary (not mandatory) action by the Secretary of Agriculture.

Bear Parts

Legislation would prohibit interstate and international shipment of bear viscera (gallbladders and bile) in order to halt the poaching of American bears for Asian medicines, cosmetics, and shampoos.

STATUS: Rejected in the House-Senate conference on the farm bill.

Enforcement \$ - 2001

Letters circulated on the Hill during the spring of 2001 called for an increase of \$3.8 million for various programs to improve USDA enforcement of Animal Welfare standards at puppy mills, laboratories, zoos, circuses, airlines, and other facilities.

STATUS: Signed into law on November 28, 2001, increased funding by \$5.152 million, a total figure higher than in either the House or Senate bills.

Enforcement \$ - 2002

Letters circulated on the Hill during the spring of 2002 called for an increase of \$4.1 million to improve USDA enforcement of the Animal Welfare Act and Humane Slaughter Act.

STATUS: The Agriculture Appropriations bills have not yet been acted on by the House or Senate (at the time this scorecard is going to press).

ANWR

The Arctic National Wildlife Refuge (ANWR) provides unique habitat for more than 200 species, including caribou, musk oxen, grizzly bears, wolves, polar bears, and migratory birds. Energy development in this critical refuge is certain to upset its special ecosystems.

STATUS: The House and Senate have not reached agreement in conference on the energy bill or ANWR issue.

CAFOs

Under prior law, enormous, concentrated animal feeding operations (CAFOs) were ineligible for taxpayer subsidies for manure disposal and environmental compliance under the Environmental Quality Incentives Program (EQIP). The farm bills crafted by both the House and Senate Agriculture Committees lifted this restriction on EQIP funds. STATUS: The final farm bill allows new subsidies up to \$450,000 per producer under EQIP for manure management with no eligibility restriction on the size of the operation, although the bill does restrict corporations from receiving multiple subsidies.

<u>Farm Bill</u>

H.R. 2646, a massive bill setting farm policy for the next six years, became a vehicle for consideration of animal protection issues because the USDA has prime responsibility for many of these concerns.

In addition, the following items were addressed during the House and Senate conference on the farm bill:

Humane Slaughter – a resolution was retained in both
House and Senate bills that the USDA should fully enforce
the Humane Slaughter Act and report violations of this law.

<u>Birds</u>, <u>Rats</u>, <u>and Mice</u> – the final bill excludes birds, rats, and mice used in research from the definition of animals

under the Animal Welfare Act. These species account for 95 percent of all animals used in research – an estimated 20-25 million animals.

<u>Baby Chicks</u> – commercial airlines will be required to carry baby chicks as ordinary mail, rather than as live animals needing modest protection from crushing, freezing, overheating, and other dangers.

Migratory Bird Killing – USDA is not exempt from the National Environmental Policy Act and its agents will not be allowed to kill migratory birds without regard for protective laws

A number of other important animal protection issues are working their way through Congress as well. Of particular interest:

<u>Antibiotic Overuse</u> – to stop factory farms from using massive quantities of antibiotics to compensate for inhumane conditions.

<u>Horsemeat</u> – to prohibit the slaughter, import, export, trade, and transport of horses for human consumption. <u>Animal Cruelty/Juvenile Delinquency</u> – to qualify for federal grants state and local programs designed to prevent animal cruelty by juveniles and to counsel juveniles who commit animal cruelty offenses.

<u>Pet Trusts</u> – allow individuals to establish charitable remainder trusts for their companion animals under a uniform national system.

What You Can Do

On these and other issues, the powerful influence of industry voices can rise above those of concerned citizens. So we need to redouble our efforts and make sure legislators hear from us... We hope you will study this scorecard and use it as a tool to ensure that your legislators represent your interests in Washington, D.C. Let legislators know you are watching and you appreciate their support for pro-animal legislation: or if they haven't done enough, let them know you'd like to see them do more...




