European Skijor Harness (Guard Harness)

Product Review by Ami Giestson

I first became interested in this harness during the IFSS World Championships 2001 in Fairbanks, Alaska, when race vet Dr. Jerry Vanek asked me if I had seen the type of harness the Europeans were using and how he felt the design was better for a skijoring dog than an Xback harness.

side a dog with an X-back and I

couldn't believe that I had never noticed the high angle of the tug line coming off of my belt. The X-back harness was being pulled up in back...could it be affecting how the dog runs or the transfer of power? I can't give a definite answer, but the new harness just makes sense. The following is an excerpt from the product description found on the Howling Dog Mushing Supplies web site.

"The Guard Harness works better for skijoring than the standard sleddog harness. The line angle between the dog and skijorer (or biker, runner) is steeper than the line angle between a dog team and a sled. When a skijoring line is connected to a typical X-back harness, the steeper angle will cause a lifting force on the harness. The design of the Guard Harness creates a flatter line angle

and the dog's pull force is more evenly distributed."

The only time I wouldn't recommend using a Guard Harness is when training a dog that doesn't keep a tight line. The tug line hooks in at the middle of the back and makes for easy tangles when hanging loose.

On Friday, Saturday, and Sunday of the Plum Creek/CKC shows, DSA sponsored a public education booth about snow dogs. This was done to provide good information to the public in the hopes of helping to offset a mass purchase of 'snow dogs' (as a result of the Disney movie) which could have a serious impact on rescue groups later in the year.

Members of DSA, the Columbine Country Malamute Club and the Rocky Mountain Siberian Husky Club participated by bringing brochures and staffing the booth. During peak times on Saturday and Sunday we had

dogs from all three breeds at the booth for the public to meet and learn about. We had brochures and posters on each breed, a poster with a comparison of the breeds, a cautionary poster for anyone considering acquiring any of these breeds, and handouts of all the posters. Public attendance was better than expected since we were located in the agility building. The booth was advertised in several places in the main exhibition building.

Also, a member of the High Country Newfoundland Club asked DSA to participate in a carting demo, which took place on Sunday before Best of Breed. Several Bernese Mountain Dogs and Newfoundlands pulled carts and lined up in the ring and then the finale was Jane Reller's Sydney and Cooper in lead, and Deb Castro's Thunder and Lightning at wheel pulling Jane's Grizzly cart around the ring and then leading everyone around the ring a final time and then outside the ring. The crowd seemed to really enjoy the demo and we received many nice comments. Many thanks to Deb Castro for providing her dogs, staying late, and running with the dogs to guide them around the ring. Also, thanks to Mardee Ward-Fanning who stumbled upon us as we were preparing to go in and helped us get the dogs rolling into the ring and then helped us cart back to the grooming area. Where: Devil's Thumb Ranch, Tabernash, CO



What's Up: After everyone checks in at the lodge, we'll meet and talk at the Yurt at 10 a.m. Then, it's out on the snow to play and learn. Devil's Thumb has some equipment to loan (at no charge for us) and I will have equipment for loan or sale.

Cost: \$2 for a dog trail pass (they have over 5 miles of dog trails!); their skijor equipment rentals (a harness/belt) are usually \$3 but they are not charging for us. Ski rentals are \$12 for full day, \$8 for half day. There is food available at the lodge.



Colorado State Animal Related Legislation

Senate Bill: SB02-048 ~ Animal Cruelty

- Senate sponsor: Deanna Hanna (D-21)
- · House sponsor: none
- Current status: Assigned to Senate Appropriations Committee. (The Senate Judiciary Committee passed the bill and referred it to the Senate Appropriations Committee.)

This bill strengthens statutes regarding cruelty to animals. The major provisions of the bill are summarized below.

- Changes the penalty for a second or subsequent conviction for cruelty to animals from a misdemeanor to a felony
- Creates the felony offense of aggravated cruelty to animals and enhances the punishment for a second or subsequent conviction
- Increases the amounts of mandatory fines for convictions
- Replaces anger management treatment

programs for animal cruelty offenders with treatment programs concerning animal abuse and animal cruelty prevention

- Requires the court to issue a mandatory restraining order in animal cruelty cases
- Requires that adults arrested pending investigation of animal cruelty charges be fingerprinted and photographed; requires the same for juveniles in certain circumstances

House Bill: HB02-1116 ~ Cruelty to Animals

- House sponsor: Joyce Lawrence (R-45)
- Senate sponsor: Ken Gordon (D-35)
- Current status: Assigned to House Appropriations committee. (The House Criminal Justice Committee passed the bill and referred it to the Appropriations Committee.)

This bill strengthens the state's cruelty statute. The major provisions of the bill are summarized below.

- Makes a second or subsequent animal cruelty conviction a class 6 felony
- Requires an offender with a second or subsequent animal cruelty conviction to be committed to the county jail or placed on home detention if the offender is sentenced to probation
- Requires the court to enter judgment against the offender for the cost of care
- Creates the felony crime of harming a police animal
- Requires a person convicted of harming a police animal to be committed to the county jail or placed on home detention if the offender is sentenced to probation
- In the case of a person convicted of harming a police animal, requires the court to enter judgment against the offender for the cost of care


