- 5. Donate a crate.



Dog Park Etiquette

Once you and your dog get to the dog park, it's tempting to just stand back and watch all the activity. But everybody will have a much more rewarding time if you observe some basic rules. Dog parks aren't a right, they're a privilege. - please don't let bad behavior ruin things for everyone else.



Always keep your eye on your dog. Mischief can happen quickly.

Never leave your dog unattended.

Always clean up after your dog. Most parks have poopbags or scoopers, so use them. This is a primary reason that dog parks get complaints, so pay attention and **pick up the poop**.

Make sure your dog is current on her shots and has a valid license.

Don't bring dogs younger than 4 months to a dog park. They won't have had all the necessary inoculations that allow them to play safely with other animals.

Don't bring a female dog in season. Spayed/neutered animals are recommended.

Don't bring more than three dogs. It subjects parks to overuse, and if they're not your dogs, you may not have full control over them.

Keep your dog on-leash until you get to the off-leash area. This is not just respectful to other park users, it's much safer for your dog.

If your dog becomes unruly or plays rough, leash him and leave immediately.

If you must bring children to a dog park, supervise them closely.

Don't smoke or eat while at the dog park. Cigarette butts and food wrappers are tempting treats to dogs, but bad for them.

Always observe all of the rules posted at your local dog

park. Each town has its own set of regulations, so please follow them.

Area volunteers request that no sticks be thrown in pond, as clean-up is time consuming.





- Donate an x-pen or baby gates.
- Donate a food dish or a stainless bucket for a crate
- 8. Donate a leash.
- Donate a collar.
- 10. Donate some treats or a bag of food.
- 11. Donate a halti or promise collar.
- 12. Walk a dog.
- 13. Groom a dog.
- 14. Donate some grooming supplies (shampoos, combs, brushes, etc.).
- 15. Go to the local shelter and see if that dog is the breed the shelter says it is or go with rescue to be a second opinion on the dog.
- 16. Make a few phone calls.
- Mail out applications to people who've requested them.
- Provide local vet clinics with contact information for educational materials on responsible pet ownership.
- 19. Drive a dog to and from vet appointments.
- 20. Donate long distance calling cards.
- 21. Donate the use of your scanner or digital camera.
- 22. Donate the use of a photocopier.
- 23. Attend public education days and try to educate people on responsible pet ownership.
- 24. Donate a gift certificate to a pet store.

- 48. Help organize and run fundraising events.

- Bring the foster take out so the foster doesn't have to cook dinner.
- Pay a house-cleaning service to do the spring cleaning for someone who fosters dogs all the time.
- 65. Lend your artistic talents to your club's newsletter, fundraising ideas, t-shirt designs.

Bits and Pieces

Dogs Make You Healthier

According to a recent study presented to the American Heart Association, people who have pets experience only half the increase in blood pressure under stress than those without a pet. It has long been accepted that the activity of stroking a pet lowers blood pressure, but this is the first time that simply having a pet has been shown to have health benefits to humans.

Sick Puppy?

A survey conducted by a petstore chain reveals that 31% of pet owners surveyed said they had taken at least one day off work to care for a sick pet.

Better Dogs, or Bad-Tasting Postal Workers?

The USPS reports that dog bites are down 6% from the previous year, and credits employee training and greater public awareness as factors in the decrease. The chompin'-est towns are said to be: Houston (49), Chicago (37), Miami (35) and Los Angeles (32).

Pregnancy Tests for Pooches (and no rabbits die)

There is now a blood test to determine if a dog is pregnant. Until now, sonagrams or manually feeling for pups were the only methods available to prospective parents. Human pregnancy tests don't work, because they rely on the detection of a hormone which dogs don't produce.

Expect to pay the vet \$20 - \$30 for the test, and results are available in a few days - the wait needed while the blood sample is tested at a lab that runs animal-related blood tests. In the future, the test manufacturer, Synbiotics Corp, hopes to have a home-pregnancy test that requires only drool.

Dog Shoots Man

A German hunter was shot and killed by his dog - the suspect isn't talking, but police surmise that the man placed his gun on the car seat, and when the dog jumped into the car, it landed on the loaded gun, fatally shooting the hunter. Baaaad dog.


