Morris Animal Foundation names new President

Englewood, Colo., August 2001 - Morris Animal Foundation proudly announces the election of its new president, Cheryl A. Wagner, a resident of Alpharetta, Ga. A Trustee of the Foundation since 1995, Wagner joins a distinguished list of leaders for the animal health focused organization.

As president, Wagner will help promote public awareness about the Foundation by acting as a spokesperson and representing the Foundation at public functions. She will also serve as a member of the Executive Committee. Wagner was elected president at the Foundation's Annual Meeting at Lake Tahoe, Nevada, in June.

"I feel the Foundation is at the second most exciting time in its history," said Wagner. "The first was, of course, when Dr. Morris decided it was time to do something for the animals. Today, because of our fiscal responsibility and good stewardship of donations, we are poised to make a big difference in animal health and veterinary medicine."

As chair of the development committee, Wagner has encouraged her fellow Trustees to share Morris Animal Foundation's mission with fellow animal enthusiasts. Wagner provides direct financial support for Foundation-funded studies each year. She would like to increase public support for Foundation-funded health studies by identifying people who are committed to making a difference in animal health.

Wagner is an avid dog enthusiast and a distinguished Samoyed breeder under the kennel name Tarahill. She has also owned and shown Morgan horses. A resident of Atlanta since 1991, Wagner currently shares her home with three Samoyeds.

"My ultimate goal is to put the Foundation out of business," said Wagner, a champion for all animals. "I would like nothing better than to announce that we had successfully eradicated canine cancer, colic in horses, feline leukemia, and removed mountain gorillas and others off the endangered species list."

In addition to animal health interests, Wagner devotes time to her family and to philanthropy. Her interests include education and the arts. Wagner has served as Trus-

tee for several organizations including Eaglebrook School and the Georgia Ensemble Theatre. She has chaired the committee for the Magnolia Ball, an annual fund raising event to support the preservation of Bulloch Hall, the historic home of Theodore Roosevelt's mother. Wagner is a native of Michigan.

Former Morris Animal Foundation presidents include well known actress and animal enthusiast, Betty White, and, most recently, blind actor, composer and inspirational speaker, Tom Sullivan, who served an 11-year term. Both White and Sullivan are current Foundation Trustees.

Morris Animal Foundation is a 53-year-old nonprofit organization dedicated to ensuring a healthier tomorrow for companion animals and wildlife. Since its inception, the Foundation has funded 1,000 humane animal health studies with funds exceeding \$25 million. One hundred percent of all annual, unrestricted contributions support animal health studies, not administration or the cost of fund raising. The park was lovely, and the sub sandwiches, chips and ice cream were simply yummy!








